Speech by Senator Datuk Megat Zulkarnain, President PESAKA (Malaysia)

Datuk Megat Zulkarnain welcomed President IPSF Mr. Prabowo Subianto and Central Board of IPSF, Founding Members, President of Regional Federation, President of National Association/Federation, and Delegates to the Congress and WPSC 2022.

He expressed sincere gratitude to the IPSF for their efforts in organizing the event. He noted the significant milestone of the WPSC and emphasized the shared mission of achieving Olympic status for IPSF.

Emphasizing professionalism and international standards, he highlighted the choice of venue — the International Convention Center — with world-class facilities designed to elevate Pencak Silat's global image. He underscored the importance of conducting this WPSC representing growth and commitment at an international level.

He conveyed strong support for the leadership of Mr. Prabowo Subianto, praising his courage, strength, and global influence as essential to realizing their goals. He acknowledged the presence and efforts of Central Asian countries promoting Pencak Silat, including Uzbekistan, Tajikistan and Kyrgyzstan. He also announced the inclusion of Bosnia and Herzegovina as a new member nation, with their Pencak Silat's federations overseen by their Ministry of Defense.

Datuk Megat highlighted the need for all representatives—from international to regional and national federations—to actively contribute toward their mission. He expressed confidence in achieving the dream of Olympic recognition for IPSF relying on united efforts and leadership.

He reflected on his personal long-term commitment, noting the aging generation's responsibility to prepare the younger generation to advance the sport to new heights. He called on all involved to stay prepared, lead, and assist in promoting Pencak Silat globally.

Speech by Mr. Muhammad Shiddiq, Vice President of IPSI (Indonesia)

Mr. Muhammad Shiddiq opened his speech by extending peace and blessings upon the audience. He greeted distinguished guests and expressed gratitude for the opportunity to convene this important Congress after two years of challenges, particularly due to the Covid-19 pandemic. He acknowledged the commendable

efforts of the IPSF's leadership for successfully managing and overcoming various problems during this period.

Highlighting a key achievement, he praised for the breakthrough that the upcoming year's movement, despite earlier difficulties in SEA Games Cambodia, will allow the Pencak Silat competitions to proceed with great lobbying and extraordinary efforts.

He articulated the ambition to elevate Pencak Silat as a recognized competitive brand, emphasizing the need for strong, bold, and visionary leadership to carry out lobbying efforts effectively. He called for unified and great support from Indonesia and urged Mr. Prabowo Subianto to continue his leadership role to advance the sport.

He emphasized the importance of cooperation, unity, and hard work shoulder to shoulder within the Pencak Silat martial arts community. He encouraged the socialization of competition regulations to ensure all countries are aligned and carry out their commitments whole-heartedly.

Speech by Mr. Yasril, President of PERSISI (Singapore)

Mr. Yasril began his address by highlighting the significant status of Pencak Silat as one of the top 10 most important activities in Singapore at present, placing it even above educational priorities. He emphasized the comprehensive development programs implemented by PERSISI Singapore, which include athletes from youth to senior levels.

He detailed the initiatives involving senior clubs and youth programs aimed at nurturing new athletes and advancing their skills to higher competitive levels. The programs also engage athletes who have previously competed, helping them regain competitive form at senior levels.

He also spoke about the organization's efforts in conducting seminars, sales courses, workshops, and community development projects to identify and correct shortcomings in Singapore's Pencak Silat landscape.

He expressed gratitude for the full support received from the Singapore government, which has been instrumental in these development efforts.

In terms of international cooperation, Mr. Yasril welcomed collaboration with other countries interested in training or development partnerships. He extended an open invitation to discuss methods to foster the growth of Pencak Silat in Singapore and beyond.

Speech by Mr. Ibrahim Abdul Karim, President of PERSIB (Brunei Darussalam)

Mr. Abdul Karim expressed his profound gratitude for the opportunity to attend the Congress and WPSC this year. He emphasized that the event fosters strong bonds, inspires, and motivates other countries in the sport of Pencak Silat.

He congratulated and applauded the Steering Committee members for their hard work in establishing new rules and regulations and ensuring compliance during recent seasons in SEA Games Vietnam. After enduring challenges caused by the global pandemic, the finalization and implementation of these new regulations have been successfully achieved.

Mr. Abdul Karim stressed that with efficient application and adherence to these new rules by the competition officers, Pencak Silat competitions can be conducted smoothly and effectively.

To promote understanding of the new regulations, over 300 participants attended a virtual seminar conducted by IPSF in 2020. Additionally, PERSIB held roadshows across Brunei to further illustrate the new rules.

He highlighted that five international institutes from Brunei participated in a training of trainers' course in February of this year. These trainers have contributed significantly by conducting further training for coaches at the national level.

Mr. Ibrahim extended heartfelt thanks and congratulations to Datuk Megat and PESAKA for successfully organizing the 19th WPSC. He expressed hope for the continued success of upcoming championships, noting the participation of twenty-six countries.

Touching on the trajectory of Pencak Silat, he acknowledged its recognition as a competitive sport since its inclusion in the 2018 ASIAN Games hosted by Indonesia and praised the leadership of Mr. Prabowo Subianto for remarkable international achievements.

On behalf of PERSIB, Mr. Ibrahim extended official support for Mr. Prabowo Subianto's re-election as President of IPSF, expressing confidence that Mr. Prabowo's leadership and military experience will elevate Pencak Silat to new global levels, including the goal of Olympic inclusion.

- Mr. Teddy Suratmadji acknowledged the dispatch of 29 new Persilat formations since Congress 2015. He expressed gratitude and appreciation, prompting a round of applause for the Presidents of participating countries including Algeria, Bangladesh, Chile, China, Cyprus, Estonia, Kazakhstan, Kenya, Malaysia, Kuwait, Kyrgyzstan, Lebanon, Moldova, Morocco, Nepal, New Zealand, Oman, Palestine, Serbia, Sudan, Syria, Tajikistan, Tunisia, Uganda, UAE, United Kingdom, and the United States.
- He reviewed key Pencak Silat events since 2015 including SEA Games and Marine Games hosted in Singapore (2015, 2018, 2023), Danang (2016), Kuala Lumpur (2017), ASEAN games (2018, 2019), the Philippines (2019), and upcoming SEA Games in Vietnam (2022) and Cambodia.
- On June 21, a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between IPSF and the National Olympic Committee (NOC) of Cambodia was signed, solidifying plans for IPSF activities in Cambodia next year.
- Mr. Teddy highlighted the organization's ongoing efforts to achieve Olympic inclusion. He emphasized the importance of democratic governance within the organization, noting current regulations allow presidential candidacy to representatives of only 4 countries, which is currently being amended.
- He acknowledged efforts to revamp competition rules to make Pencak Silat matches more dynamic and enjoyable, citing improvements in athlete stamina requirements and competition pacing.
- IPSF is aiming for self-regulation, reducing dependence on delivery officials through international discussions and agreeing on an annual assistance fee of 200 USD from member countries. Financial transparency is emphasized, with signed financial reports provided to contributing members.
- The organization is also working towards compliance with WADA (World Anti-Doping Agency) and membership in the General Association of International Sports Federations (GAISF).
- The roadmap to Olympic inclusion was outlined, targeting the Paris 2024 Olympics for a formal presentation, followed by LA 2028, Brisbane 2032, and ultimately aiming for Indonesia's centenary of independence in 2045.
- Mr. Teddy expressed confidence in achieving an official Pencak Silat opening event at the LA 2028 Olympics and participation in Brisbane 2032, highlighting continued cooperation with the Asian Pencak Silat Federation.

I- ASIAN PENCAK SILAT FEDERATION (APSIF)

Report by Dr. Sheik Ala'uddin, President of APSIF

1. Historical Background and Achievements

- APSIF organizational discussions started in 2009 with Mr. Haji Ali bin Ali Rustam for placement in Asia.
- In 2010, collaborations with IPSF and leadership under Mr. Prabowo Subianto as president began.
- Successful launch APSIF on April 16, 2011, including the establishment of the first match and significant documentation on Asian traditions and martial arts leadership.
- Emphasis on the application of traditions across religions to promote tolerance and loyalty in martial arts leadership.

2. Organizational Development and Regional Expansion

- The APSIF plays a supportive role in the IPSF. Current focus is on establishing Pencak Silat in Kuala Lumpur.
- Initial presidency held by Mr. Abdullah Shafi'i, followed by Dr. Alauddin's stewardship and developmental efforts since 2015.
- Collaborative projects with OMAO, Congress activities, and Pencak Silat promotion in Cambodia, including law enforcement training.
- Martial arts development activities extended to India, Canada, Sri Lanka,
 Taiwan, and 39 out of 45 Asian countries.

3. International Engagement and Multi-Country Initiatives

- Participation and demonstration of Pencak Silat in various Asian countries including Turkmenistan, South Korea, Kyrgyzstan, Nepal, Uzbekistan, Kazakhstan, Armenia, Taiwan, Russia, and China.
- Recent efforts to support Pencak Silat inclusion in the Olympics targeted for 2036, with preliminary lobbying efforts starting 7 years prior.

4. Multi-Event Participation and Strategic Collaborations

 Involvement in multi-sport events, Asian beach games held in Bali, Ghana, Jakarta, and others.

- Digital assemblies and cooperation with the International Counselor of Traditional Sports & Games.
- Federations from Afghanistan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan, China, Taipei, Hong Kong, Japan, South Korea, Mongolia, Bhutan, India, Maldives, and others actively involved in Pencak Silat promotion and event participation.
- Ongoing efforts to integrate national federations with National Olympic Committees (NOCs) across Asia for multi-event eligibility.

5. Challenges and Future Plans

- Some federations operate independently of their NOCs, requiring further integration and lobbying for event participation.
- Continued expansion and outreach in Middle Eastern countries including Iran, Iraq, Jordan, Kuwait, Lebanon, Oman, Palestine, Saudi Arabia, Syria, and UAE.
- German-based Rifaih Academy established by Mr. Rifaih to foster Pencak Silat development in Europe, marking the international reach beyond Asia.
- In total, Pencak Silat is present in 45 Asian countries, with 39 having national federations and 13 affiliated with their NOCs, indicating work needed for broader formal inclusion in sporting events.

6. Closing Remarks

- APSIF continues commitment to develop Pencak Silat as a recognized martial art with Olympic goals.
- APSIF strengthening international federations, promoting cooperation, and enhancing the sport's visibility and organizational structure remain priorities.

II- EUROPEAN PENCAK SILAT FEDERATION (EPSF)

Report by Mr. Irfan Rashid, o/b President EPSF

- Representing both the President and Secretary General of EPSF, Mr. Irfan delivered a brief report on European Pencak Silat Federation activities.
- Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic (2018-2020), EPSF participated annually in events including: Belgium Open, European Open in Denmark, Netherlands hosted by MPSF (sponsored by the Indonesian Embassy), Dutch Open (Netherlands Federation with Embassy support), Print Accident Festival in London (hosted by DSF UK with Embassy sponsorship)

- EPSF arranged programs with the Vice President of the Tech Pensioner Federation involving projects in West Japan and Indonesia, aimed at expansion in Turkey.
- Numerous activities such as training workshops, festivals, championships, and national events were held by European National Federations in countries including the Netherlands, United Kingdom, France, Turkey, Azerbaijan, Italy, and Russia.
- The COVID-19 pandemic impacted events and progress from early 2020 through 2022 due to lockdowns and restrictions on sports and social activities.
- During the pandemic, EPSF organized virtual workshops in collaboration with IPSI West Java and hosted by the Netherlands Federation, including successful Jurus Tunggal Zoom sessions with the French Federation.
- Following relaxation of COVID restrictions, training sessions and championships resumed in European countries.
- The Belgium Open and European Open Championships were postponed until 2023.
- Despite pandemic recovery, threats from COVID remain, and disruptions persist due to the war in Ukraine:
 - Ukrainian Pencak Silat activities have ceased.
 - The Spanish Pencak Silat Federation halted activities after the passing of its president during the pandemic.
 - EPSF is working with CELAC groups in Spain to form a new federation in Spain.
 - Contacts are also ongoing to establish federations in Portugal, Norway, Scandinavian countries, Greece, Bosnia, Albania, Macedonia, and the region when COVID conditions improve.
- The EPSF Congress usually coincides with the World Championships every four years. Due to insufficient attendance, the Congress has been postponed, potentially to the Paris Open or the next European Championship where adequate participation is expected.
- The current EPSF board will continue operations until the next Congress can be held.
- Financial concerns were raised regarding membership fees:
 - European countries have historically paid an annual fee to EPSF.
 - Since IPSF membership began, members are required to pay fees to both IPSF and EPSF, causing financial strain.

• EPSF requests that IPSF consider allocating a budget portion from European membership fees to support EPSF operations.

III- AMERICAN PENCAK SILAT FEDERATION (PSFA)

Report by Mr. Jacob Richter, President of the PSFA

1. Opening Remarks

- Mr. Jacob Richter introduced himself and expressed gratitude. He noted no formal presentation was prepared but promised one next time.
- He referenced the 2015 Congressional Constitution, Section 13.2, outlining the regional board's functions as organizer, coordinator, initiator, and facilitator of Pencak Silat activities in the Americas.

2. Regional Overview

- The Americas region comprises 35 sovereign nations and six IOC-recognized National Olympic Committee (NOC) territories.
- The Pan-American sports organization serves as the Olympic Continental Association.
- PSFA was appointed in February 2020.

3. Activities and Developments (2020-2022)

- March 2020: USAA Vice President Chris Robinson secured Pencak Silat inclusion at Arnold Classic World Event.
- Virtual opening of World Festival Pencak Silat City with participation from multiple Western countries.
- July 2020: USA coaching staff issued training guides for pandemic conditions.
- April 2021: Brazil launched a new Federation led by Mr. Peterson Mendez.
- April 2021: Chile officially joined the International Pencak Silat Federation (IPSF).
- Williamsburg, VA and Ann Arbor, MI, held National Waseduri training on new rules
- August 2021: Williamsburg hosted the first USA tournament under new rules with 150+ athletes.
- October 2021: National Summit for PSFA USA with field testing, training, and Triple S Congress participation.

- August 2021: Mafia Pasta Productions created a 40-minute short film featuring Pencak Silat combat scenes.
- November 2021: Recruitment seminar in Massachusetts expanded membership.
- March 2022: Launch of new PSFA promotional video on rules.
- April 2022: IPSF and PSFA executives met in Colorado for training, planning, and legal consultation.
- April 2022: PSFA engaged with future Mexican Federation for recruitment.
- 2022: Chile engaged with Indonesian Embassy for promotional event; Brazil continued strong marketing efforts.
- May 2022: Canada held the first national tournament with new rules despite prior COVID cancellations; efforts underway for official sport recognition with provincial authorities.
- Suriname's PSFA conducted Zoom training and TV programming during COVID; resumed physical activities and planned tournaments for 2022 under newly elected female president Ms. Lawrence Jeremy.

4. Vision and Challenges for the Region

- PSFA aims to assist national federations in navigating road to Olympics and to host the first World Championships in the Western Hemisphere.
- Aspires to include Pencak Silat in major games/events such as World Games, Arnold Classic, Martial Arts World Championships, regional games, and ultimately the Olympics.
- Challenges include:
 - Lack of widespread recognition and public information.
 - Poorly developed training resources and officials (ITOs).
 - Public perception of Pencak Silat as unsustainable due to internal confusion and presentation issues.
 - The sport's current event timing and presentation undermine its appeal.
- Calls for implementing low-cost improvements globally to enhance the sport's image.
- Acknowledges the strong social media presence of the IPSF President with 6 million followers as a resource.

- Pencak Silat is a relatively new sport in Algeria, and awareness among the general population is still developing. Despite this, the sport has experienced significant growth in the country.
- Regarding the African continent, there is a strong aspiration to establish an African regional body for Pencak Silat. This initiative will build on the foundational work already accomplished in Algeria.
- Mr. Lahcene expressed his hope and wishes for the World Championship to be a grand success and a historic occasion for all involved.

- Mr. Les Tayu Irawan stated that the current goal and mission is to promote Pencak Silat to the countries in the ocean region which consists of 14 countries and 9 district dependencies.
- The 14 countries named include Australia, Fiji, Tirupati, Marshall Island, Micronesia, Nauru, New Zealand, Palau, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, Solomon Island, Tonga, Dubai, and New Zealand.
- The 9 district dependencies are American Samoa, Cook Island, France, Poland, Asia, Guam, New Caledonia, Niue, Northern Mariana Island, Wallis, and Fortuna.
- The objective is to develop a plan to establish Pencak Silat at the ocean level for one year, aimed at athletes from these countries.
- During the Covid period, many people lost access to facilities, and individuals developed their own lifestyles, resulting in an inability to gather.
- Currently, at PSA, emphasis is placed on developing referees-jurors and coaches, beginning with online course at the national Australian level, guided by Ibu Titih and inaugurated by Pak Benny.

- He stated that they are working under the balance martial art confederation, which is managing all necessary roles as a National Olympic Committee (NOC) and Government Organization (GO), providing support for the event.
- Accreditation has been submitted to the National Sports Council of Bangladesh through the balance policy council.
- Efforts are ongoing to secure approval by attending meetings, with a strong commitment to steadily increase support and development day by day.

- Dr. Slimi shared his role as a religious leader using Concepcion to help youth by offering positive alternatives to guide them toward better citizenship, noting some of his students' successes academically and in military service, including four athletes currently in special forces.
- He emphasized the transformative power of sport and the importance of perseverance, describing the interconnectedness of the community and recognizing contributions to planning and rule development.
- He requested support for two main initiatives:

- A marketing strategy to enhance awareness and recognition inspired by Indonesian and Malaysian films, distinguishing their sport from MMA, which dominates North America.
- 2. Collaboration with embassies and consulates for non-financial support and legitimacy, underscoring that Canadian athletes self-fund their participation and need government representatives' endorsement.
- Dr. Slimi concluded by acknowledging the need to leverage North American marketing expertise in video production and media. He also expressed deep commitment to advancing the sport's presence in Canada and North America while fostering cultural appreciation and effective communication.

- Mr. Andre Mewis provided an overview of the partner courses held across Europe, including Germany, Netherlands, Austria, France, and Belgium.
- He highlighted notable events such as the World Championships in Bali, Sydney, Malaysia, and various lecture and seminar courses in Singapore (2017), virtual seminars with updated competition regulations (2019), and training courses (2020) and recent activities in 2022.
- Focus has been on basic jury courses, training camps, and competitions.
 Recently, they hosted a training camp in Berlin, Germany, with participation from 9 nations and over 60 participants.
- Additional training camps took place in Thailand, France (Paris and Marseille),
 Guadeloupe, Spain, Brunei, and Indonesia between 2017 and 2019.
- The Federation organized the first-ever German Open Championship and maintains close collaboration with the Netherlands Federation, assisting in developing Dutch championship regulations and participating jointly in national competitions from 2016 to 2019.
- Participation in various Opens was noted: Austria Open (2017), French Open (2018), Belgium Open (2017-2019), with the German team (SEDAT) recognized as the best in Belgium Open 2017.
- He recounted participation in the 2016 World Games in Jakarta, World Championships in Bali (2016), the Junior World Championships in Malaysia (2018), and World Championships in Singapore (2018).
- Mr. Mewis shared his 7-year involvement in SEDAT and his 35-year international career, starting as an athlete and moving up to coach, team

- manager, and currently President of the German Federation. He noted this is his 15th World Championship attendance.
- He emphasized that all efforts and events are conducted without sponsors or member fees, maintaining fairness and transparency in all activities.
- Mr. Mewis expressed gratitude for the opportunity to speak and his commitment to advancing Pencak Silat across Europe through collaboration, training, and competition.

- The Indian Federation took over the promotion of the sport from previous leadership in 2015 and has since actively promoted men's and women's participation in India.
- The Federation has participated in every World Champions League, BC Champions League, and other regional leagues, helping to elevate the sport's popularity and gain experience nationally.
- Official recognition has been achieved as a national sports federation by the Government of India, among martial arts federations, although full recognition by the National Olympic Committee (NOC) of India is pending due to NOC suspension.
- The sport is recognized within the Indian police force and is supported by grants from the Government of India to promote it nationwide. Government jobs are also provided in police and paramilitary forces linked to the sport.
- The Federation is included in the School Games Federation, a member of the International School Sports Federation, and a member of the All India University Federation, tied to the Federation of International University Sports (FISU).
- It is also recognized by the National Anti-Doping Agency (NADA) and actively participates in anti-doping programs.
- The Federation conducts multiple development programs including "Coach the Coaches" and community-level coaching initiatives to widen the athlete base throughout states and districts.

- The Indian Federation is notable for being fully digital with an online registration system for athletes on its website, operating paperlessly and providing membership and documentation free of cost.
- The Federation has a quota system reserving 40% participation for women and 60% for men.
- Recently, the Government of Jammu and Kashmir, where the Federation is based, has committed to providing 20 government jobs to athletes achieving national or international honors.
- Mr. Iqbal expressed his gratitude and commitment to the continuous development and promotion of the sport in India, ensuring wider participation and government support.

- He then formally handed over the microphone to Datuk Megat, referred to as Presiden PESAKA, who would lead the election process.

- Datuk Megat Zulkarnain noted that IPSI is not authorized to make nominations but affirmed that the consensus remains in favor of Bapak Prabowo Subianto.
- Invoking a formal declaration in the name of Allah (bismillahirrahmanirrahim),
 Datuk Megat Zulkarnain announced Bapak Prabowo Sublato as the elected
 President of the International Perchak Siddharth Federation for the next four
 years.
- He then handed over the microphone to the newly elected President, Bapak Prabowo Sublato, to deliver his official inaugural speech.

- Mr. Subianto expressed deep gratitude to all federations, both regional and national, for their continued trust and honor.
- He indicated his initial intention to step down but was encouraged by others to continue his mission until its completion.

- He highlighted the challenges faced in promoting the martial art, Pencak Silat, particularly in securing sufficient support and resources despite its ancestral roots.
- Mr. Subianto acknowledged his personal financial contributions towards promoting Pencak Silat, alongside commendation for key individuals who have driven the sport forward with passion and commitment.
- He conveyed encouragement upon hearing reports of international progress in promoting the sport across America, India, Pakistan, and Central Asia and expressed optimism about reaching a pivotal moment of growth.
- Emphasized the need to amend the constitution to align with Olympic standards, ensuring all national federations have a vote, fostering a democratic leadership election process.
- He outlined a two-year term until the next Congress and election, signaling a roadmap for future development and organization.
- Mr. Subianto shared his role as Indonesia's Minister of Defense and his plans to convene Indonesian military defense attachés worldwide to support PERSILAT's mission.

Announcement of Hosting the 2023 World Festival

- Mr. Subianto announced Indonesia's willingness to host the 2023 World Festival, proposing mid-July or August as potential dates for the event.
- He assured support for countries with long travel distances by subsidizing tickets, ensuring broad participation from all national federations, particularly those less financially able.
- Highlighted direct flights to Jakarta from key international cities to facilitate travel.

Future Promotion and Marketing Plans

- Mr. Subianto described plans for extensive marketing and media promotion, recognizing the sport's potential as a business venture.
- He mentioned the concept of martial arts safaris and increased cooperation with national federations to build connections and promote Pencak Silat worldwide.
- Distribution of protective gear and equipment (Mattress and Body Protector) is planned for all federations, building upon prior initiatives in Vietnam and Cambodia.

Closing Remarks

- Mr. Prabowo Subianto expressed sincere thanks for the members' confidence and their dedication to PERSILAT.
- Mr. Subianto formally announced the closure of the PERSILAT 2022 Congress.
- The meeting concluded with aspirations for continued progress and growth for Pencak Silat worldwide.
