The year 2024 marked a pivotal turning point in Pencak Silat's journey toward global recognition and Olympic inclusion, establishing itself as a significant milestone in the sport's history. Through strategic diplomacy, competitive excellence, and cultural promotion,

The momentum began with a historic Pencak Silat exhibition during the Paris Olympics on July 27, 2024, where the sport showcased its rich cultural heritage and technical sophistication to a global audience. This exhibition was not merely a display but a strategic diplomatic initiative, highlighted by the visionary leadership of Mr. Prabowo Subianto and his historic meeting with International Olympic Committee President Thomas Bach. This engagement represented a critical step in positioning Pencak Silat for future Olympic consideration, emphasizing the sport's universal values, competitive structure, and its unique blend of martial artistry and cultural expression.

Following this diplomatic breakthrough, the 8th Asian Pencak Silat Championship in Uzbekistan (October 15–21, 2024) further solidified the sport's regional standing, bringing together nations across Asia to compete at the highest level. This championship demonstrated Pencak Silat's standardized competitive framework, its ability to unite diverse cultures through shared sporting values, and its growing appeal as a platform for international exchange and cooperation.

The year culminated with the 20th World Pencak Silat Championship and 5th Junior Championship in Abu Dhabi (December 18–22, 2024), which expanded the sport's global reach beyond Asia. This event not only highlighted the international growth of Pencak Silat but also emphasized its commitment to nurturing future generations of practitioners, ensuring the sustainability and evolution of the art form for years to come.

These achievements were further validated by UNESCO's recognition of Pencak Silat as Intangible Cultural Heritage, acknowledging its profound cultural significance beyond its sporting aspects. As we reflect on these milestones, 2024 stands as a foundation year for Pencak Silat's Olympic aspirations, setting the stage for its continued evolution as both a competitive sport and a cultural treasure that bridges traditions and modernity on the global stage.

## **PENCAK SILAT EXHIBITION DURING THE PARIS OLYMPICS, 27 JULY 2024**



The exhibition of Pencak Silat was held at the Pullman Hotel in Paris on July 27, 2024. The performance, attended by dignitaries and sports officials, served as a strategic effort to elevate Pencak Silat's global profile and advocate for its inclusion in future Olympic Games.

The presence of Mr. Prabowo Subianto, President of the International Pencak Silat Federation (IPSF-PERSILAT) and Indonesia's 2024 presidential election winner, underscored the significance of this initiative.



Prior to the exhibition Mr. Prabowo Subianto held a crucial meeting with Thomas Bach, President of the International Olympic Committee (IOC). This meeting marked a pivotal

step in the campaign to bring Pencak Silat to the Olympic stage. Thomas Bach emphasized the importance of standardization, governance, and global competitiveness—key benchmarks for any new sport, including Pencak Silat.

Eight Indonesian martial artists delivered a powerful 15-minute performance filled with acrobatic strikes, precise throws, and synchronized choreography.

The intensity of the demonstration captivating an audience of hundreds, including French officials and international sports leaders.



The performance was interrupted only by the host's request for a second round, driven by the overwhelming enthusiasm of the crowd. This moment highlighted the high stakes and personal investment behind the effort to showcase Pencak Silat.

In his public address following the exhibition, Prabowo Subianto articulated a bold vision for the future of Pencak Silat, that is to introduce Pencak Silat more massively to the world. Momentum like this at the Olympics or like the film "The Raid" that can stir the world. He also asked for more festivals so the world can see.



This quote encapsulates Mr. Prabowo's belief that strategic exposure during global events like the Olympics is essential. He emphasized the need to shift from academic congresses to dynamic, public festivals—events that can generate widespread interest and media attention.

Furthermore, Prabowo underscored the importance of momentum, noting that the global popularity of martial arts can be amplified through cultural phenomena.

His appeal to leverage the Olympics as a platform aligns with the success stories of sports like rock climbing, which transitioned from niche activity to Olympic sport through visibility and advocacy.

The event also fostered key collaborations, most notably with Stephan Fox, President of the Recognized Independent Sports Members Alliance (AIMS), who committed to advocating for the inclusion of Pencak Silat among the six sports AIMS aims to bring to the Olympics. He said that Pencak Silat can provide maximum competitive sports activities."



This strategic alliance with AIMS, along with the support from Dito Ariotedjo (Indonesian

Minister of Youth and Sports), Raja Sapta Oktohari (President NOC Indonesia), and now the IOC's own engagement through Thomas Bach, creates a powerful coalition to push for Pencak Silat's Olympic inclusion.



The Paris 2024 exhibition was not merely a cultural performance—it was a calculated diplomatic move. With Prabowo Subianto leading the charge and having personally met with Thomas Bach, the IOC President, Indonesia is positioning Pencak Silat as a global athletic and cultural treasure worthy of Olympic recognition. The sport's unique blend of discipline, artistry, and physical prowess, combined with growing international visibility, makes a compelling case for inclusion.

The road ahead will require consistent global promotion, standardized competition frameworks, and sustained advocacy. But as Prabowo's words suggest—“Wider exposure”—the momentum is building. With the world now watching and with the IOC actively engaged, the dream of Pencak Silat's Olympic debut may be closer than ever.

## 8TH ASIAN PENCAK SILAT CHAMPIONSHIP, UZBEKISTAN, 8-16 OKTOBER 2024



The 8th Asian Pencak Silat Championship 2024 was held in Bukhara, Uzbekistan from October 15-21, 2024, competing across multiple categories in both Tanding (combat) and Jurus (artistic) disciplines. The Asian Pencak Silat Championship, first held in 2011, has grown in prestige and participation with each edition, serving as a qualifying event for international competitions including the Asian Games.

The Uzbekistan Pencak Silat Federation, in collaboration with the General Authority of Sports of Uzbekistan, spearheaded the organization of this championship. Their efforts were supported by the Embassy of Indonesia in Uzbekistan, the Government of Uzbekistan, and PERSILAT, providing technical sanctioning and oversight.

The choice of Bukhara as the host city was particularly significant, given its status as a UNESCO World Heritage site and its historical importance along the ancient Silk Road. This selection symbolized the bridge between Eastern and Western cultures that Pencak Silat represents.

All competitions were held at the newly renovated Bukhara Sports Complex. Participants were accommodated in designated hotels within Bukhara city, with transportation provided to and from the competition venue.

The championship featured competitions across two main disciplines Tanding (Match/Combat) Categories with 10 weight classes for both men and women:

Class A (-45kg), B (-48kg), C (-51kg), D (-54kg), E (-57kg), F (-60kg), G (-63kg), H (-67kg), I (-71kg), J (+71kg).

Each match consisted of three 2-minute rounds with 1-minute rest periods.

Jurus (Artistic) Categories: Tunggal (Single), Ganda (Double), Regu (Team), Solo Creative.

The 8th Asian Pencak Silat Championship served as more than just a sporting event—it represented a significant diplomatic achievement. The collaboration between Indonesia (Pencak Silat's country of origin) and Uzbekistan (the host nation) exemplified how sports can foster international cooperation and cultural exchange.





Key diplomatic outcomes included:

- ❖ Strengthened bilateral relations between Indonesia and Uzbekistan
- ❖ Increased recognition of Central Asia's role in international sports
- ❖ Promotion of Pencak Silat as a vehicle for cultural diplomacy
- ❖ Advancement of the sport's campaign for Olympic inclusion

The championship also contributed to UNESCO's efforts to preserve and promote intangible cultural heritage, as Pencak Silat was recognized on UNESCO's Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity in 2019.



### Conclusion

The 8th Asian Pencak Silat Championship 2024 in Bukhara, Uzbekistan successfully achieved its objectives of promoting the sport across Asia while demonstrating the host nation's capability to organize major international sporting events.

The championship set new standards for organization and participation, with 25 nations competing across multiple categories.



The event's success has several important implications:

- ✓ It validates PERSILAT's strategy of globalizing Pencak Silat while preserving its cultural essence
- ✓ It enhances Uzbekistan's reputation as a capable host of international sporting events
- ✓ It strengthens the case for Pencak Silat's inclusion in future Olympic Games
- ✓ It establishes a foundation for future collaborations between Asian nations in sports development

Looking ahead, the momentum generated by this championship should be leveraged to further develop Pencak Silat at both competitive and grassroots levels, ensuring its growth as both a sport and a cultural practice that continues to unite diverse communities across Asia and beyond.

## The 20th World Pencak Silat Championship and the 5th Junior World Pencak Silat Championship, Abu Dhabi, UAE, 18 to 22 December



The 20th World Pencak Silat Championship and the 5th Junior World Pencak Silat Championship, held from 18 to 22 December at the Abu Dhabi National Exhibition Centre (ADNEC), marked a historic milestone—being the first time such a joint championship took place in the Middle East.

During Opening Ceremony, the championship was formally opened by Minister of Foreign Affairs of Indonesia HE Sugiono. Upon completion of championship, he also closed the championship.

The event drew over 1,100 participants, including athletes, coaches, officials, referees, and judges, from 57 nations, making it the largest gathering in Pencak Silat history. This unprecedented international turnout underscores the sport's rapidly growing global

appeal, particularly in regions beyond Southeast Asia.

This event not only showcased athletic excellence but also served as a diplomatic platform, strengthening the bilateral ties between Indonesia and the UAE.

Indonesia emerged as the overall champion in both competition categories. At the 20th World Pencak Silat Championship, Indonesia led the medal tally with 11 gold, 7 silver, and 5 bronze medals.

Vietnam followed with 10 gold, 3 silver, and 3 bronze medals, while Malaysia ranked third with 6 gold, 9 silver, and 4 bronze medals.

In the 5th Junior World Pencak Silat Championship category, Indonesia again topped the chart with 11 gold, 3 silver, and 2 bronze medals. Singapore came in second with 9 gold, 3 silver, and 8 bronze medals, and Kazakhstan was third with 5 gold, 7 silver, and 10 bronze medals.



Youth and Sports Minister Dito Ariotedjo noted that Indonesia's participation in this event is part of cooperation with the UAE Minister of Sports.



In April along with the UAE Minister of Sports, he signed a cooperation agreement that included supporting Abu Dhabi as the host for this 20th World Pencak Silat Championship," he added.

Indonesia sent around 170 athletes who carried the mission of embracing participating countries through Pencak Silat and showing our best abilities at this championship.

"And most importantly, the spirit and values of Pencak Silat can be spread to all participating countries, strengthening friendship between nations. This is a symbol of Indonesia-UAE friendship and evidence of the UAE's commitment to support Pencak Silat so it can be promoted worldwide (recognized by the IOC and contested at the Olympics)," Minister Dito hoped.

This vision aligns with efforts to include Pencak Silat in the 2032 Brisbane Olympics, with Abu Dhabi's championship serving as a powerful catalyst.

The event was a testament to the strong partnership between Indonesia and the UAE. Indonesian Ambassador to the UAE, Husin Bagis, highlighted the significance of the collaboration that this championship reflects the strong Indonesia-UAE partnership and our shared commitment to preserving cultural heritage through sports."

The UAE's support has been instrumental. The country has formally recognized Pencak Silat through the UAE Sports for All Federation, and the discipline has seen growing participation from Emiratis and expatriates, including regular training sessions held at the Indonesian Embassy in Abu Dhabi.



The Abu Dhabi 2024 championships have marked a turning point for Pencak Silat. With a record number of nations participating, a dominant Indonesian performance, and high-level diplomatic and IOC engagement, the sport is now firmly on the map.
